On her friend's advice, Eilidh decides to ride out the wave of her quarter-life crisis by throwing herself head first into a slew of new hobbies, hoping her mental health can survive the plunge.

Twixt was first developed as part of Aila's masters course at the Royal Birmingham Conservatoire, before debuting at Birmingham Fest in 2023 followed by the Dundee Fringe and a one off performance at The Old Hairdresser's in 2024.
